Scripture to Meditate On:

2 Corinthians 3:18

And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.

Reflection Questions:

- In our *Assurance of Pardon* we stated that Jesus was our deliverer and said He offers us complete freedom- "freedom from guilt, freedom from self-inflicted shame, freedom from sin that keeps us from joy." Consider each of those- guilt, shame, and joy-robbing- how and where do you see those operating in your life? Do you see any patterns? When did that start?
- How would you explain the terms "justification" and "sanctification"? Why are they important to understand in the Christian life? What do they have to do with our everyday lives?
- Take some time to reflect on all you have in your life (people, provisions, accomplishments) and acknowledge all of that as gifts from the very hand of God. Take some time to thank Him and worship Him for his care for you.
- What is a *sacrament*? Why is the Lord's supper important?

Questions addressed:

1. Is sanctification monergistic or synergistic? Or how do our imperfect works love and sacrifice during the Christian life fit within God's process of making us more like Christ?
2. What is the balance between having self-satisfaction in our accomplishments and the humility in knowing that it is only through Christ that we can do any good at all? Where is there room for healthy, human pride in this situation?
3. How can cliques be avoided and / or dismantled in our church?
4. With an omnipotent God, why is faith required for salvation? Why couldn't God say all are saved regardless of belief?

5. How should we view are loved ones that passed away and we know and trust that they are in Heaven with Jesus?
6. What does the reformed denomination believe about communion? Where do we lie between it is the literal body and blood of Christ and it's nothing more than something we do in "remembrance"? What can we do personally to make communion a more meaningful experience spiritually?
7. How do we approach non-believers with the gospel. When people belittle our beliefs and our faith in Jesus how should we respond?
8. Sin is sin- Not sure how God views sin in terms of degrees- As a father I apply punishment based upon the severity of the mistake by my children. The sin doesn't make my love disappear- but just as I apply punishment does God factor this at all? And if not why did he instill this logic based emotion in his creation and exhibit examples of this especially in the Old Testament?
