Reflection Questions:

- In our *Call to Worship* we read from Psalm 100 which commands us to give thanks to the Lord and bless his name! Think back over your life and remember times of the Lord's faithfulness, care, and guidance. As you think about those times, consider Jesus present there with you. How does that change the way you see it? Take some time to thank him for his constant care and oversight in your life.
- What is the purpose of marriage and why is that significant?
- Wives: What's most difficult to you about this call to 'submission'? How can you better reflect the love of the church for Jesus in the way you lovingly respect your husband?
- Husbands: What's most difficult to you about sacrificially loving your wife? How can you better reflect the love of Jesus for his church in the way you sacrificially love your wife?
- If you are married - what is going well in your marriage? Thank God for those things together. What needs work? Commit to regularly asking God's help in those things together. Do you need some help - talking with some friends, a pastor, or a counselor? If so contact Pastor Ryan and he can help.

READ Together: Ephesians 4:22-25

22 Wives, follow the lead of your own husbands as you follow the Lord. 23 The husband is the head of the wife, just as Christ is the head of the church. The church is Christ's body. He is its Savior. 24 The church follows the lead of Christ. In the same way, wives should follow the lead of their husbands in everything. 25 Husbands, love your wives. Love them just as Christ loved the church. He gave himself up for her.

ASK:

- What is Paul telling moms and dads in these verses?
- After reading these verses why would you say marriage is so important?
- How does Jesus love the church? (Then help them see that that is how Jesus loves them! They are part of the "bride of Christ" He loved them so much and wanted to be with them forever that he died to save them!)

PRAY: God, you are really great! We are so thankful that Jesus loved us so much he died for us so we could be yours forever and ever! Help mommy to be the wife you want her to be. Help dad be the husband you want him to be. We pray our neighbors will know about Jesus when they see how mom and dad love each other. Thanks for loving us Jesus! We love you! Amen.
